





One of the earliest guides aimed at those looking to migrate west to the American frontier, when that was composed of Kentucky, Indiana, Louisiana, Ohio, Tennessee, Mississippi, Illinois, Missouri, Alabama, Michigan, and the North-Western Territory (which became Wisconsin and Minnesota), as well as western portions of New York, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. 




